INTRODUCING WARD FARM, LARGEST TO-DATE

Everything we do is created through collaborations. Ward Farm at 2230 Main St. is a perfect example of how we join with partners to make our community stronger. Ward Manufacturing is providing significant financial funding along with a half acre of their land to be farmed by Evanston Grows this spring. (see below for volunteer opportunities)

We are planning a weekly farm stand, cooking programs, family events and garden tours as some of the opportunities at the new farm that can contribute to the building dynamic relationships with the neighborhood. Adjacent to the new Ward Farm are Infant Welfare Society of Evanston, an early childhood education provider, and The Aux, a commercial hub dedicated to healing, wellness and racial equity.

Greenwise Organic Lawn Care, The Mulch Center, and Arbor Green Tree Service have all generously contributed in-kind services to the new collaborative farm.

EDUCATION WRAP-UP

While gardens are sleeping, EG staff, partners and volunteers are busy providing education to increase awareness and resiliency in our community. Some of the education partnership included working with a STEAM class at ETHS, tabling at ETHS Civics Fair, and teaming up with NU Form & Function on marketing strategies to reach diverse audiences.

In March, two EG "Food as Medicine" classes taught by Chef Q will help senior citizens learn how to easily incorporate nutrient-rich produce into their diets for better health outcomes. Then, Master Gardener and EG Board Member, Jocelyn Mallard, along with Master Gardener and EG Volunteer, Diane Ouellette will teach school-age campers at Fleetwood's spring break camp, how to grow seedlings and garden at home and in community!

INTERNS WANTED

Workforce development and career education are important components of building urban agriculture infrastructure in our community and beyond. Paid internships are an important part of that equation.

UPDATE-- EVANSTON'S NEW URBAN FARM

As a result of Evanston's <u>Participatory Budgeting election</u> last fall, Evanston Grows (EG) was given the opportunity to use ARPA (American Recovery Plan Act) funds to build a <u>new one acre farm</u>. Since then, City officials and EG leadership have been working together to identify a plot that can become the future home of the urban farm. It will be built and managed by EG, along with terrific input and support from community members. It's a long process, folks, and will be worth the effort— a farm for health equity, education and community—right here in Evanston! We will keep you updated!




APPRECIATION EVENT HONORS VOLUNTEERS
